COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.1 All the applicants who are provisionally selected for admission become bonafide students of the college from the time they pay their tuition fees in full or part as per procedures adopted by the college.

- 1.2 All the bonafide students of the college will be issued identity (ID) cards. Students should always keep the ID card with them and produce the same on demand.
- **1.3** Students should not leave the campus without proper permission during the working hours.
- **1.4** Students should assemble in their respective lecture halls five minutes before the bell and maintain silence. Students are asked to stand up in the class when lecturers or other officials enter the class room until they take up their seats.
- **1.5** Students can leave the class room only when the class is over.
- **1.6** During the class hours no one is allowed to wander or loiter in the college premises.
- **1.7** Students are advised not to do anything that deface walls, door, windows, furniture etc., or damage the properties of the college.
- **1.8** Writing, scribbling on the desks, benches, walls, door, and black board or on the floor is prohibited. The offenders will be punished by imposing fine as per the decision taken by the college authorities.
- **1.9** In case of non-identity, the whole class will be responsible for the damage caused and collective fine will be collected from all the students of the class.
- **1.10** Students should not disturb the seating arrangement in the classroom.
- **1.11** The act of the students that would tarnish the image of the college either directly or indirectly will be dealt severely.
- **1.12** All the students are expected to extent their co-operation in keeping the premises of the college neat and tidy.
- **1.13** Students are strictly forbidden from collection of money for any purpose without prior written permission of the principal.
- **1.14** They also should not circulate any kind of notice among the students or post any kind of information on the notice board or walls or on the black board without prior written permission from the principal.
- **1.15** Students should not conduct any kind of meeting or assembly in the college campus without prior written permission from the principal.
- 1.16 No students can bring outsiders to the college premises. However, for extracurricular or Co-curricular activities, the principal shall sanction permission to bring outsiders.
- **1.17** Smoking, drinking, drugs and other vices are strictly prohibited in the college premise. The offenders will be given suitable punishment including dismissal from the college, if it is necessary in the interest of students and the college.
- 1.18 If any students engage themselves in conflict or clash with a fellow classmate or other class students in or outside the college campus are dealt seriously, as consequence of immediate suspension or termination from the Institution.
- **1.19** Ragging of any kind in the college, hostel or even outside the college campus is an offence. Students guilty of the offence will be handed over to the police authorities for necessary action. Further they will be dismissed from the college.
- **1.20** Properties lost in and outside the campus when found students should hand over to the college office. The owner of the property can claim it after providing evidences for his/her ownership.
- **1.21** Students are forbidden from entering the college office and staff room during unspecified hours.

- **1.22** Any students found prohibit other students from attending classes, inciting strikes or disobeying the instructions /order given by the professors will be expelled from the college.
- **1.23** Students taking part in political, communal or any antisocial activities will be severely dealt with.
- **1.24** The principal decision shall be the final in the matter of punishment given to students for violation of the rules and regulations.
- **1.25** Any student found contravening the rules and regulations of the college is liable to be punishable by the principal.
- **1.26** Students are expected to watch the college notice board regularly for official or general announcement notified. Ignorance of any notice thus posted will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to the company with it.
- **1.27** Using of mobile phone inside the college campus is banned. Defaulters' mobile will be seized and it will be **returned only after completion of the course** (or) students will be **levied fine of Rs.3000**/- for using of cell phone.

DRESS CODE

- **2.1** All the students should adopt the dress regulation stipulated by the college, otherwise they will not be permitted to attend the classes.
- **2.2** All the students should adopt the dress regulation Boys should wear formal pant/shirt, plain jean/T-shirts with collar (full or half sleeves). Cow-boy pattern dress /faded pant is strictly prohibited.
- **2.3** All the students should adopt the dress regulation Girls should wear sarees / half sarees and blouses with sleeves. Churidhar /Salwaar with sleeves and thupatta are also permitted.
- **2.4** All the students should adopt the dress regulation All the dress materials may be of any color, plain or printed but should not bear any obscene words, designs, pictures, insignia etc.,
- **2.5** All the students should adopt the dress regulation Students should wear ordinary shoes or slippers.
- **2.6** All the students should adopt the dress regulation Students who have not followed dress code, they will not be allowed to attend the classes.
- 2.7 All the Male student must to come with decent hair cut with clean saved face, defaulters will be viewed seriously

ATTENDANCE

- **3.1** All the students should adopt the addressed regulation of Attendance compulsorily, as per the University of Madras prescribed attendance eligibility.
- 3.2 All the students must to enter the college campus before 9.00 a.m., defaulters will not be permitted to enter the campus and they will send back to home.
- 3.3 Attendance will be marked for every period of the day. No student shall be absent himself/herself out the college without prior permission. Leave letter should be submitted for the period of absence. All the leave applications should be endorsed by the parent or guardian. Leave will be sanctioned only on the basis of the recommendation of the concerned professor and the Head of the Department.
- **3.4** Leave applications should be submitted along with medical certificate.
- **3.5** Under normal circumstances student will not be permitted to apply leave for on or two periods.

- **3.6** Absence for any period without permission will be treated as absent for half-aday. Absence for one period in the forenoon session and again for one period in the forenoon session will be treated as absent for the whole day.
- **3.7** Any student absenting himself / herself for more than three days without valid reason shall be fined and the fact shall be informed to his / her parents.
- **3.8** Absconding from classes will be dealt with severely. The punishment may involve fine or suspension from the College.
- **3.9** Habitual absentees name will be put on the notice board. Similarly, the name of the irregular students will be display on the notice board.
- **3.10** The name of the student absents for more than 15 days without leave or valid reasons will be removed from the rolls. Thereafter he/she has to be readmitted as per the rules and regulations.
- **3.11** In an academic year students can normally avail one day leave in a month or 10 days together in a year. Availing leave over and above ten days will entail a fine of Rs.5/- per day of absence.
- **3.12** Students are normally expected to score 90% attendance to appear for the examination. However, condonation of shortage of attendance may be granted on medical grounds as per the rule and regulations of the University. Students who score not less than 75% of attendance only will be sent to the University Examination.
- **3.13** Normally students are not allowed to come late to the class. However, a grace time of five minutes shall be granted by the concerned professor.
- **3.14** Students coming after grace time will not be permitted to enter the class. However, he/she may be admitted to attend the classes the following working hours.
- **3.15** Habitual late comers are liable to be punished by imposing fine Rs.10/-. The decision of the principal in this regard based on the regularity and behavior of the student is final.

FFFS

- **4.1** Tuitions fees should be paid within the specified period
- **4.2** Tuition fee for the first year UG/PG courses should be paid fully in one installment at the time of admission together with all the specified special fees. All the fees required to be paid to University of Madras shall be collected at the time of admission and also the following year as prescribed from time to time.
- 4.3 Tuition fees, special fees, etc. once paid will not be refunded.
- 4.4 Tuition fees payable for the second and third year shall be accepted either full (one installment) or two installments. All other fees including special fees will be accepted only in one installment.
- **4.5** The fees shall be paid on or before the tenth working day in each term. Thereafter the fees with a late fee will be collected as follows:

First 7 days	Rs.100/-
Upto 15 days	Rs.200/-
Upto 30 days	Rs.300/-
Upto 45 days	Rs.500/-

4.6 Defaulter name will be removed from the roll and he/she may be readmitted in the classes with payment of Rs.2000/- as a readmission fee.

- **4.7** The rules regarding payment of fees are applicable to all the students including scholarship holders.
- 4.8 Students leaving in the middle of the course should pay the fees of the entire course as they cause an irrevocable permanent vacancy of seats in the particular course.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

5.1 Students must apply to the principal for any kind of certificates to be issued by the college. Ordinarily a notice of two days is necessary for the issue of any certificate. The following fees will be collected.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- **6.1** Government scholarships are available annually to eligible students belonging to SC/ST. They are tenable for the period of the entire course on condition that their character, conduct and academic records continue to be satisfactory.
- **6.2** Disbursement of the scholarship amount will be made only to those students who have a record of 90% attendance as per the government order.

COLLEGE ASSOCIATION

- **7.1** College has a Association in school format like school of Business studies, Humanities, Life Science, Literary. The objects of the association are:
- **7.2** To afford opportunities to the members to train themselves in the art of public speaking, parliamentary practice etc.,
- **7.3** To take interest and discuss social, economic and cultural problems.
- **7.4** To cultivate their aesthetic talents. The objective shall be attained by conducting meetings, debates, elocution and oratorial contest, symposia, quiz programmes, cultural programmes etc.,
- 7.5 The best students of each class will be the representative of the association. The representative of the final year will function as secretary of the association. A membership fee will be collected from each student. The principal will be the President and the HOD/Senior most staff of the department will be the Vice President.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

- **8.1** The General objectives of this scheme are:
- **8.1.1** Service to the community while undergoing instruction in the educational institution.
- **8.1.2** To arouse the social conscience of the student.

- **8.1.3** To provide them with an opportunity to work with the people in and around the educational campuses creatively and constructively.
- **8.1.4** To contribute individually for social transformation.
- **8.2** Enrolment to the NSS is made at the commencement of each academic year. Student who desires to join this scheme should report personally to the NSS Programme officer.

LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE

- **9.1** All the students of the college are members of the library.
- 9.2 The library will be kept open on all working days from 9.00 a.m to 5.00 p.m.
- 9.3 Borrowing the books from the library will be permitted by ticket system. The library tickets are not transferable and books cannot be borrowed on behalf of others
- **9.4** Students are entitled to keep a book for one week from the date of issue, if the books are not returned on or before the due date a fine of Rs.1.00 per day book (including holidays) will be levied for the next 10 days, and Rs.2.00 per day per book will be levied for the next 10 days. The students will not be allowed to use the library till the fine is paid and books must be returned. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in the return of books.
- **9.5** The reference books cannot be taken out of the college. No one is allowed to sub lend the books taken by him/her to others.
- **9.6** The same book once issued to a student will not be issued again to him within a period of two weeks. However, the same book may be issued if there is no reservation for it.
- **9.7** Student may read magazine, periodicals and newspapers in leisure hours but are not allowed to take them home.
- **9.8** Any kind of marking, underlining, clipping or annotation of books is forbidden. Researcher shall be responsible for damage done to the books belongs to the library and shall be required to replace such books or pay the value thereof.
- 9.9 Silence should be maintained in the library
- **9.10** All Payments including fine shall be paid in the college office and the receipt should be shown to the librarian.
- **9.11** The librarian may recall any book at any time even when normal period of loan has not expired.

SPORTS AND GAMES

- **10.1** College will provide physical activities for all the students. Separate sports hours shall be allotted for students.
- **10.2** Yoga is compulsory for all the students, to control their mind and body.
- **10.3** Playground is situated within the college campus. Facilities are available to play Cricket, Volleyball, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Football, Badminton, Chess, Carrom and Athletics.
- **10.4** With a view of developing a sense of team spirit and to encourage the spirit of healthy environment, Inter and Intra Collegiate competitions are conducted annually.

EXAMINATIONS

11.1 Internal Assessment examination will be conducted every 25th to 30th working day, besides individual staff members may conduct class test (One hour) at short notice.

- **11.2** Semester examinations will be conducted in the month of November and April. University model examinations will be conducted in the month of October and March.
- 11.3 Attendance is compulsory for all the examinations/tests conducted.
- **11.4** Negligence or indifference towards the tests / examinations will be dealt severely.
- **11.5** Absence to tests/ examination without valid reason will be treated as gross disobedience. Such students will be fined @ rate of Rs.200/-per paper in tests/examinations.
- **11.6** Students who are securing less than 15 marks in the Internal Assessment Tests / Model Examinations will be levied fine of Rs.50/-per paper. Continued poor performance or absence for more than one test in each subject will lead to debarring the students from appearing for the University Examination.
- **11.6** Students should not indulge in any kind of malpractice in examinations. Candidates found guilty of malpractice shall be punished as per the decision taken by the faculty members.
- **11.7** As per the rules of the university, students who lacks 75% of attendance will not be permitted to take the examinations. However, in certain genuine case, condonation of shortage of attendance is permitted up to certain limits on payment or condonations fee as fixed by the University.

HOSTEL

12.1 Fully Furnished Hostel facilities will be provided for the men students inside the college campus.

CANTEEN

13.1 College provides the canteen facilities to the students with subsidized food facilities. Canteen will be kept open on all working day from 8.30 a.m to 9.00p.m

ADMISSION TO UG COURSES

- **14.1** Candidate with a pass in the Higher Secondary Examination (+2) conducted by the Government of Tamilnadu or its equivalent as fixed by the University of Madras are eligible to join the degree courses.
- **14.2** Minimum age 17 as on July and upper age limit is 21 year (5 years relaxed for SC/ST and Women Students). Candidates who have passed the Examination other than Higher Secondary Examination of Tamilnadu state should produce the Provisional eligibility certificate obtained from the University of Madras before the admission.
- **14.3** Director of Collegiate Education and University of Madras admission eligibility rules should be followed for choosing of candidates.
- **14.4** Admission will be made through the College Committee for admission based on the Government of reservation policies, rules and regulations. Spot admission will be made for vacancy seats in first come first served basis.
- **14.5** Mode of Admission: Candidate when called for Interview must produce the following original certificates.

For Higher Secondary(Tamilnadu) & CBSE Students

- a. H.S.C Mark Statements
- b. Transfer Certificate
- Community certificate from a competent authority in case of BC/MBC/DCN/SC/ST only.
- d. Aadhar Card & Address Proof

e. Bank Account detail for SC/ST & Girls student who had schooling in Government School from 6th to 12th standard. To remit the scholarship.

Students from other state should produce the following certificate

- Provisional Eligibility obtained from University of Madras (before Admission)
- ii. Recognition Certificate from University of Madras (after Admission).
- iii. All relevant document should be submitted at the time of admission.
- **14.6** The Certificate will be retained in the college office and will not be returned under any circumstance till the student leaves the institution. Therefore, the students are advised to take sufficient photo copies of all the certificate before submitting the originals to the college.
- **14.7** Admission will be confirmed only after the interview and complete payment of admission and tuition fee.
- **14.8** Selected candidates should pay the fees immediately after the interview. **Fees once paid will not be refunded.**
- **14.9** Admission of the students to any course will be provisional and will be subject to the approval of the University of Madras. Students must satisfy themselves that they are eligible for admission. After admission if they are found not eligible the college is not responsible for it. They will lose their seats and also the fees paid.
